Approach:



- Anonymous online survey gathering statements on "It is ok to..."
 and "It is not ok to..."
- Statements reflect real experiences of people who have worked, or are working, on research vessels
- Statements presented in video are a combination of the ideas submitted
- People appearing in the video are volunteers, not necessarily those who submitted statements, or those statements that they present
- Funded by Natural Environment Research Council (NERC), UK

- Can be shown at pre-cruise briefings, or generally to raise awareness
- Freely available to be re-used on YouTube or a copy can be provided
- Subtitles currently available in Dutch, English, French, German,
 Portuguese, Spanish


